	<p><i>i. Maintenance and Safety</i> Cllr Foden reported that the climbing frame had deteriorated very rapidly and it needs to be taken down and the area made safe. He agreed to ask Brocklehursts for a quote for dismantling it. Cllr Miles proposed that a sum of £300 be spent on dismantling the climbing frame and making the area safe Cllr Burns seconded the proposal All in favour Resolved: the sum of up to £300 be spent on dismantling the climbing frame and making the area safe.</p> <p><i>ii. Public Realm, Road and Pavement Maintenance and Road Safety</i> Cllr Leather reported that the current lights from the train station were not fit for purpose and the proposed new lights would be fitted in sections with handrails. The only other option would be lights that were 55 foot in height and these would affect the surrounding residences. She agreed to view some of the lights and handrails in situ before a decision is made. Concerning Chelford Road she had met with Paul Kenyon as residents had requested lines in the middle of the road and it was felt that the speed signs were in the wrong place. Following discussion it was thought that working jointly with Over Alderley Parish Council would be advantageous and also to encourage people to report dangerous driving on this road. Cllr Burns reported that she had attended a meeting about a route review on Bonis Hall Lane held at The Town Hall and she had asked for information on impacts on the area of new roads.
